What is SFRB?

- "SFRB shall provide efficiency, equity, and consistency in student fee reviews. The SFRB shall serve as a liaison between the student body and the University administration in determining the needs of the students and the levels and types of service they desire for this student fees."
- SFRB is comprised of fee-paying students known as "Voting Members" or "Student Members"
- SFRB is chaired by the ASCSU Student Body Vice President

Voting Members

- Students must be fee-paying students and enrolled in at least one credit at Colorado State University.
- Any ASCSU member is eligible to apply to serve.
- Students selected to serve on SFRB who are paid employees of a fee-funded area must abstain from any votes specific to that fee-funded area.
- The ASCSU Vice President shall select the members of the board and those members must be presented to the ASCSU Senate for ratification.
- Participation on SFRB is voluntary and shall not be compensated in any financial manner or be granted any academic credit.

- Members who are returning were asked why they wanted to return and how they are able to assist the incoming members.

The SFRB Timeline

Summer

- The Vice President reads through the Institutional Fee Plan and SFRB Bylaws, making any updates that are needed.
- The Vice President reaches out to the fee areas and Mike Ellis to ensure the correct contacts are listed.
- The Vice President works on the Fall Visit Calendar and the Spring Presentation Calendar.






Fall

- The SFRB Applications go live at the beginning of the semester.
- The Vice President interviews and presents the members to the ASCSU Senate.
- The Board visits the different Fee Areas, taking tours of those areas.
- A Vice Chair for the Board is elected at the second meeting.

Spring

- The Fee Areas visit the Board to present their budgets and if they are asking for a fee increase
- The Board votes on the legitimacy of the presentation and the final fee proposal
- The Final Approved Recommended
 Fee Package is presented to the
 ASCSU Senate at the end of the
 semester and voted on ensuring
 SFRB followed it's process.
- The Bill is presented to the University President and the Board of Governors.

The Final Approved Recommended Fee Package

What is the Final Approved Recommended Fee Package?

- "At the end of the Spring Semester, the Student Fee Review Board shall present the final approved recommended fee package to the ASCSU Senate"
- The Fee Package recommendation is presented to the University President
- The University President makes recommendations to the Board of Governors in the late Spring. This recommendation has never deviated from SFRB's recommended fee package.
- The Fees are approved by the Board of Governors and then implemented for the Fall Semester.

Common Questions Students Have

Who can serve on the Board?

- ANY STUDENT WHO IS A FEE-PAYING STUDENT
- This means both undergraduate students and graduate students

What is the difference between SFRB and BSOF?

- The Board for Student Organization Funding, BSOF, allocates funds towards student organizations for educational programming, speakers, food/catering, and more! Our \$150,000 budget goes towards programming and events that will benefit and bring opportunity to the student body and the larger CSU community.
- SDPS Offices would work with BSOF for funding for events.

Does SFRB fund the SDPS Offices?

- No, SFRB does not fund the SDPS Offices
- SDPS Offices are funded through the General Fund, which is a fund made up of Tuition dollars, State funds, and external funds.
- The Student Disability Center and Women's Gender and Advocacy Center are SDPS Offices AND a student fee area. HOWEVER, student fees only fund a very small, very specific area within the Offices, which were initiated by students.

What does the workload look like for Members?

- Meetings are Mondays 4:00 pm 6:00 pm
- Members are encouraged, but not required, to attend the Fall Visit Days. These Visit
 Days are meant to educate the members on the inner workings of each area, where
 they are spending their funds, and (a very common question asked) if they are
 anticipating a fee increase.
- Members are also Liaison for these fee areas, these roles are picked by the member or assigned by the Vice President.
- Members are required to be in contact with their fee areas and gather any information that is asked from the Board.

The Student Fee Review Board aims to create transparency between the students of Colorado State University and the directors of the Fee Areas that are funded by students
