- Resolution #5406 - Amending The Resolution Condemning Blackface To More Accurately Reflect The Media's Involvement
 - First reading
 - Authorship: Parliamentarian Kamberg
 - Abstract: *“This resolution aims to make a correction to edit made in committee by the author of this bill that were not vetted through due process as a result of an oversight on the part of Legislative Cabinet.”*
 - Issues in original Resolution
 - 3 whereas clauses stated incorrect facts that must be remedied.
 - The role of Rocky Mountain Student Media was distorted in the Resolution, and this can cause harm to their credibility and reputation.
 - Passing Resolution #5406 removes these clauses and is the most efficient way to remedy these discrepancies.
