  1. The ASCSU Constitution Article XIII outlines the process for ratifying the Constitution, “A. Upon amendment, this Constitution shall be ratified by the majority vote of not less than 10% of the voting members of the Associated Students of Colorado State University by placement of the question “Do you vote to approve the Constitution of the Associated Students of Colorado State University?” at the end of the general election ballot.” Does 10% of voting members of ASCSU mean 10% of the student population or 10% of voters in the election?

If the Court decides to hear the case, an announcement regarding the subject matter of the case will be presented at the proceeding Senate session if deemed necessary. Any member of ASCSU may submit a briefing detailing why the Court should rule one way or another. The official rendered opinion of the Court will be delivered between a week to two weeks after receiving the request during Senate stating the requestor(s), the questions posed, and the rendered opinion. **Once an opinion is delivered to the Senate, it is not allowed to be appealed.**
